Project Update 3: April 2010



'Countryside Mobility' is a Big Lottery funded project (through Natural England's 'Access to Nature' grant scheme) aiming to improve access to the countryside for people with disabilities living in and visiting the South West.

We will be working with partner organisations to place Tramper all-terrain mobility scooters (www.tramper.co.uk) and wheelchair accessible Wheelyboats (www.wheelyboats.org) at countryside and coastal sites including country parks, woodlands and lakes across the South West. The equipment will be available to hire for a small fee for anyone becoming a Countryside Mobility member.

This will provide disabled people with a real outdoor experience, and will allow them to access new areas of the countryside with independence, whether alone or with friends and family.

April Highlights

The first sites where the Trampers will be available to hire, from June 2010:

- Berry Head National Nature Reserve (Brixham, Devon)
- Durlston Country Park (Swanage, Dorset)
- Haldon Forest Country Park (Exeter, Devon)
- Stover Country Park (Newton Abbot, Devon)

Site staff will be undertaking training to ensure they are fully prepared for operating the scheme and hiring out equipment. Disability Access Audits have also been completed for these sites to make sure they are fully accessible for disabled visitors.

Countryside Mobility Membership Scheme systems and procedures are being finalised. The initial annual charge for members of the public wanting to use the equipment will be £8.50 plus a small additional hire charge at participating sites. Proposed hire charges are £2.50 for 1-2 hours, £5 for 2-4 hours, and £10 for over 4 hours. These charges are required to cover administration costs and to support the development of the project.
