
After the Welcome Hut you will come to The Piggery.






While you are here you can.....




1. Walk around and see **the garden**

It used to have more rooms, but some of the rooms were knocked down.




The **Godolphin family** planted a **garden** a long time ago.

Can you find the **Garden** at **Godolphin**?




Charles the 2nd



Charles the 2nd was a **king**. He was friends with the **Godolphin** family.


Francis **Godolphin** helped Charles the 2nd when he needed help.

This is the **King's Room**.



The **Godolphin family** made lots of money from their **mines**.

Workers used to work in the **mine**, looking for **tin** and **copper** in the ground.



The rocks they were looking for were found deep under the ground and difficult to get to.



**Tin** is a metal found in the rocks under ground.



**Copper** is also a metal found in the rocks under ground. It is used to make coins.

Have you seen **copper** coins at home?





One of the **mines** at Godolphin is called the **Great Work Mine**.

This is only a small part of the **mine**,  
**the rest is underground**.



Look down through the grill  
to see a deep hole.



This **sign** means that  
Godolphin's **mines** can be  
dangerous.

Caution means 'be careful'.

# Meaning of words in this booklet



## Godolphin

A area in Cornwall with a house and mines that is also a family name.



## Mines

Deep holes dug in the ground to find useful rocks that contain metal.



## Tin

A type of metal found at **Godolphin**.



## Copper

Another type of metal found at Godolphin. It is used to make wire and coins and other useful things.



## Caution

A word that means the same as 'be careful'.



## Gardens

A place where plants are grown. A place to enjoy. A place where grass is kept short and tidy.



## King

A male ruler of a country that has a royal family.



## Family

Your mother, father, sisters and brothers. People that you live with.
